IAG Cargo to decreased Fuel Surcharge.

This is to advise that with effective from **6th January 2015**, British Airways will be decreasing **the Fuel Surcharge to THB 36 for all commodities and THB 18 for Perishable commodities (Fruit & Vegetable/Orchids/Frozen food only)**.

We will continue monitoring the world price of aviation fuel and we will advise you of further changes to the fuel surcharge when the price of aviation fuel move accordingly. Whilst we understand and share your concerns on the recent increases, it has become necessary as the price of fuel reach to an unimaginable level.

The index was developed by British Airways World Cargo to provide customers with more information about the calculation of fuel surcharges. It is updated on a weekly basis and posted on the **baworldcargo.com** website.

Rules For Application of Fuel Surcharge

The "Fuel Surcharge" shall apply to all consignments. The following conditions apply:

- i) The Fuel Surcharge is based on a rate per kg using the Chargeable Weight shown on the air waybill. Applied to all commodities with weight breaks at 45kg and above.
- ii) The Fuel Surcharge shall be in addition to the weight charge and shall accrue to the issuing carrier.
- iii) The Fuel Surcharge shall be inserted separately on the air waybill in the 'other charges box' and designated by the code MY or MYC ("C" denoting due carrier).
- iv) Air waybills received without such a Fuel Surcharge shown shall have the charge added or amended as appropriate by British Airways.

The fuel surcharge must be consistent with the other/incidental charges payment mode. E.g., if the handling charge is Prepaid, then the fuel surcharge must also be Prepaid.
